- 2. If the number of applications for a grade level in a school building referenced above is greater than the number of available seats for the grade level in the school building, district administration shall accept students based on priority enrollment status first. If capacity remains after accepting priority enrollment students, the administration will randomly select nonresident student applicants for enrollment using a confidential lottery process that will be completed on or before July 15 of each year.
- 3. If the nonresident student named above is not accepted for or denied enrollment at such school district, the district will provide to the parent or person acting as a parent of the nonresident student the reason for the nonacceptance or denial and an explanation of the nonresident student selection process.
- 4. The district, by virtue of being a receiving school district of a nonresident student, shall not be required to provide transportation to nonresident students unless otherwise required to do so by state and/or federal law.
- 5. If admitted to attend school in the district, the above-named nonresident student shall not be exempt from the requirements of the Kansas State High School Activities Association ("KSHSAA") regarding eligibility to participate in KSHSAA activities.
