Hello Lansing Parents and Students! I am honored to serve as the Principal of Lansing Middle School. I have been a part of Lansing Middle School since 1997 and have held several different roles in the school – I was a 7th grade classroom teacher, an athletic coach, Vice Principal, and I have been Principal since 2020. Lansing Middle School is a great place to be and that is the reason for my continued commitment to the school.
