



MABLE MAYHUGH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Mable (Messer) Mayhugh grew up in the Fulton, Kansas area. She graduated from Fulton High School in 1946. She attended Fort Scott Junior College for 2 years and Pittsburg State one semester, and started her teaching career in one room grade schools in Linn County.

Mable was teaching at the LaCygne, Kansas grade school when she married Wesley Mayhugh in 1951. In 1952, she left teaching to raise a family. In 1956, the Mayhugh family moved to Leavenworth, Kansas where Wesley worked for the Allis-Chalmers implement dealership.

In 1959, Mable returned to teaching in rural grade schools. She taught at High Prairie, Muncie, and was teaching at Hazel Dell when Kansas unified the school districts and Hazel Dell became part of the Lansing Unified District #469.

By going to a summer school and taking night classes, Mable received a B.S degree in 1969 from St. Mary's College in Leavenworth. She received a M.S. degree from Emporia State Teachers College in 1980.

She retired from the Lansing Elementary School and teaching in 1990. Mrs. Mayhugh left us on January 12, 1995. Surviving is her husband Wesley and four children, Donald, Jeffrey, Donna, and Bruce.
