Her first of 5 children was born in 1942. Her husband worked in the VA center in Excelsior Springs, Missouri. When it closed, he transferred to the VA center in Leavenworth, and the family moved to Kansas.

She started teaching in this area in 1959. She taught at Hazel Dell, Fairmount, and Richardson. When the schools unified, Richardson became a part of the Lansing Unified District #469. She had a grandson in one of her classes. She retired as a first grade teacher at the Lansing Elementary School in 1975.

Her four daughters, Sue, Mary Lee, Joyce, and Ramona are all graduates of Lansing High School. Her son, John is a graduate of the Plattsburg, Missouri High School. Three sons-in-law, John, Gary, and Michael as well as 11 of her 13 grandkids are graduates of Lansing High School.
