

DANIEL L. RIEMANN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Daniel Riemann was born on September 25, 1982 in Hays, Kansas. He moved to Lansing with his parents in 1989, where they were both employed as teachers in the Lansing School District. He completed grades 1 through 12 in the Lansing schools.

Daniel was active in numerous clubs and activities throughout his time in Lansing schools.
