Wallace Wiehe Memorial Scholarship



Wallace Wiehe grew up on the family farm two miles south of Lansing. He graduated from Lansing Rural High School in 1936. He went to Chanute Junior College on a football scholarship and later attended Kansas State. He was a veteran of World War II and served in the 20th Air Force division.

Wallace was a dairyman and farmer for 37 years before retiring in 1983. He was instrumental in organizing the Wyandotte Rural Water District. In 1985, he was chosen "District Manager of the Year" by the Kansas Rural Water Association. Wallace also served as a director of the Lansing Kansas State Bank and the Leavenworth County Co-op.

His two daughters, Linda and Jonell, are graduates of Lansing Rural High School and Kansas State University. His wife, Geraldine, was a charter board member of the Lansing Kansas Scholarship Fund, Inc.

- 1. Applicant must attend Kansas State University in Manhattan, Kansas.
 - *In case no applicant qualifies, the winner of the previous year is eligible to receive the scholarship, provided their grade average was 2.5 or higher the previous year at K-State.
- 2. The student must be active in community service.
- 3. A completed application, an essay of 250 words or less and <u>TWO</u> teacher evaluations with counselor section is required.
